What would you rate the book?	7/10	5.5/10






This year's Book Week will take place in the week beginning 4th of March. The theme for this week is Reading for Pleasure so we will be doing lots of reading for pure enjoyment.


There will be a parents information event about how to support your child with reading at home on Thursday 7th of March. This will be led by The Open University via video link.

Do you speak a different language? Would you like to come in to school and read a story to the children in your language during Book Week? Please contact your child's teacher to let them know when you're available.










Our second hand bookshop will be doing a tour of the classes after half-term. Look out for information on Class Dojo for when it's coming to your child's year group.

Set in London in 1926, the book follows Ma Coker- matriarch and owner of several nightclubs, her grown up children and their various shenanigans, Gwendoline Kelling- courageous ex librarian searching for two missing girls (and adventure), and a weary police inspector. The backdrop of sparkling nightlife, gang turf war and the struggle to make ends meet in post-war London creates a fascinating picture; the characters are brought to life, the story is gripping- at times violent, amusing and surprising.
